


Learn about Brazil's other tropical forest — The Atlantic Forest

High Biodiversity ... under High Threat

High floral & faunal endemism – 40% Vascular Plants, 15% Birds 27% Mammals, 62% Amphibians


Vertebrate Species Richness dark blue <5 dark red >600 species


